Indian Institute of Banking and finance (IIBF) organized a Seminar on 'Secur-e-Banking' in association with Cyber Society of India (CySI) at Chennai on the 17th Feb, 2017.

Welcoming the participants, Dr. Jibendu Misra, Chief Executive Officer of IIBF, walked the audience through the various offerings from IIBF on cyber empowerment and how the seminar would help focus on the security issues in eBanking.

In his opening remarks, Shri. U.P.Prakasham, President, CySI concurred with the CEO on the need for this seminar and outlined the initiatives taken by CySI in this regard.

In his Inaugural address, Dr. C.SylendraBabu, IPS, Addl Director General of Police, Coastal Security Group, Tamilnadu traced his experiences in dealing with cybercrimes even from the earlier days and stressed the need for people to stay alert from the innovative methods adopted by cyber criminals and the same was followed by very relevant interaction with the participative audience consisting of senior bankers and finance professionals.

Shri Vittal Raj, Founder and Partner, M/S Kumar & Raj, Chartered Accountants then spoke at length on 'Security concerns in Electronic Delivery Channels in Banks', that kept the participating senior banking officials' attention riveted to the valuable inputs provided.

In his keynote address, Shri Arjun Ram Meghwal, Hon'ble Minister of State for Finance and Corporate Affairs, deviated from a routine speech and started his session as an interactive one, prompting the elite audience to express their views on the emerging national scenario especially in the cyber space. He listened to the views expressed, taking care to note down the important suggestions and recommendations and even discussed the issues raised, immediately with the Secretariat officials present at the venue, thus reaffirming the Government's concern and commitment in the area of combatting cybercrimes.

Then followed the address on 'Compliance and Regulatory Mechanism' by Shri R.Lakshmi Kantha Rao, Chief General Manager, RBI which continued to evoke good interaction from the learned audience.

The concluding session on "Digital Evidence in Banks" by Shri V. Rajendran, Advocate and Cyber Law Consultant traced the life cycle of cybercrimes from the initial stages to the crime scene explaining the finer aspects of investigations of cybercrimes and kept the audiences' interest alive.

The seminar concluded with Shri V. Kapaleeswaran, Secretary, CySI briefing CySI's efforts towards awareness and thanking the participants and all involved for the successful conduct of the programme.
